The 16-year loan may be repaid utilizing Tax Increment Financing or Debt Service with a final payment due June 1, 2040. Joy explained that delays from King Construction are causing the entire water project completion date to be pushed back. King's initial completion deadline was Aug. 15, 2022, but is now scheduled for completion by July 1,

2023. Electrical components, which are still not expected to arrive until May, are the main factor for the delay. Water tower painting and installation of the AMI equipment (meter reading antenna) cannot be completed until King's portion is complete. Motion by Bogue to approve King Construction
