## Falcon baseball team features pitching, speed, experience

OABCIG's baseball team will look to its pitching, speed and experience as it enters the 2021 season.

The Falcons return eight letter winners, all starters, from last year's 9-5 team that finished second in the conference race with a 6-2 mark and won the conference tournament.

The letter winners are seniors Cam Sharkey (IF/OF), Preston Gill (P/IF), Trust Wells (OF/IF/P) and Eric Sibenaller (IF); juniors Easton Harms (IF/P) and Zach Hemer (IF/P) and sophomores Gabe Winterrowd (P/OF) and Treyten Kolar (P/OF/IF).

"The letter winner group of athletes has competed in several sports at various times. I'm hopeful the returning letter winners' experience will show up as performance on the field," noted coach Dan Dotzler.

Dotzler noted the team has a couple of strong pitchers in Gill and Hemer who have considerable varsity experience. Other varsity pitching potentials for the Falcons will be Harms, Winterrowd, Kolar, Kane Ladwig, Kale Ladwig and Max Webb. There are also some younger guys who have pitched junior varsity who will potentially get some innings at the varsity level this year.

"Every year, someone will step up and give us some solid mound innings at the varsity level," said Dotzler. "It will be a key for us to find depth in pitching fairly quick, as we will be playing a full schedule that includes some four-game weeks. It just kind of depends on who can throw strikes consistently for us."

The coach added the infield should be a team strength this year, as there are five starters back in Harms, Gill, Sharkey, Hemer and Sibenaller. Harms and Kale Ladwig are expected to handle a majority of the catching duties.

"There are some new guys to the program who will push the upper classmen for spots along the way," noted Dotzler. "Wells played centerfield for us last year and has been a two-year starter heading into his senior year. Winterrowd and Kolar played the corner outfield positions last year. Winterrowd and Kolar, hopefully, will give us some innings on the mound so we will need to find some other depth at the corner outfield positions."

According to Dotzler, base running should also be a positive for his team as early indications suggest this will be one of the faster groups to play Falcon baseball. "We will do some tinkering with the lineup over the first few games to put the best formula out there to score. Defensively, we should have guys who can play multiple positions and that versatility will help cinch up the defense."

Coach Dotzler stated the key to the season will revolve around how well his players can put the ball in play and how the offense materializes. "We need more consistency this year up and down the lineup over the full season. With eight starters back who are a year older, hopefully, that will be a positive on offense. Cooper DeJean lead off for us last year and was an obvious spark to our offense that we will

need to replace."

The non-letter winning players on the roster include:

Freshmen—Kelton Ladwig, Trenton Gilbert and Myles Beck.

Tyler Johnson and Jeff Rasmussen are the assistant coaches.

Dotzler listed several goals for the 2021 season. "It will be our goal to make the conference tournament championship series. Our goal is for the boys to play competitively, be in a position to win every night out and have some fun along the way while staying healthy."

When it comes to the Western Valley Conference race, Dotzler said there are a number of good teams in the league.

"The Western Valley conference will be strong this year," said Dotzler. "There will be some quality teams again this year and I am hopeful we will compete for a top spot. After winning the conference tournament last year and the returning players we have, I look for us to get the opponents best shot.

"Kingsley-Pierson, Lawton-Bronson and Woodbury Central will be very good teams based on returners; however, all of our conference teams will be capable of beating anyone on a given night, depending on who is pitching."

After a shortened 2020 season due to COVID-19, conference teams will be playing a full home-and-away, 16-game conference schedule this season. In addition, non-conference games on the Falcon schedule include matchups with Denison-Schleswig, Alta-Aurelia, Newell-Fonda, South Central Calhoun and East Sac.

Game times this season start with junior varsity games at 5:30 p.m. followed by the varsity games at approximately 7:30 p.m.




"To see improvement from the beginning of the season to the end will be a great accomplishment for our young team," said Nielsen.

The Falcons do return five letter winners from last year's team. Three of the letter winners are returning starters. 

Tesch said the key to the upcoming season will be developing consistency on offense.

"We've shown the past couple of years that we can put up runs, but not every game or even every inning. We are working to put pressure on a defense every single inning of the season," said Tesch.

The head coach said, with the talent his team returns, one of the goals for this year is to compete for a Western Valley Conference championship. He pointed to Kingsley-Pierson, Woodbury Central, Lawton-Bronson and OABCIG as the top teams in the conference.

"We feel like we are right there with those teams, but the WVC is tough from top to bottom. There are no off-nights," said Tesch.



Phelps added how well the team does

will be determined by how disciplined and how dedicated the kids are to the program. "Our kids have been working hard in the off-season with our strength/conditioning and agilities program and with our pitching and catching sessions. Many of kids have also put a lot of time in at clinics, so we believe we can put quality athletes out on the field."

The head coach said the strength of the team should be good hitting, good group of pitchers and good foot speed. Areas that have question marks going into the season are being consistent with pitching and defense (cutting out errors), discipline at the plate, leadership, staying focused, staying healthy and getting off to good starts each game and finishing games. Phelps said, while those are areas the team needs to work on, he is confident the players will improve.

Phelps expects the Western Valley Conference to be one of the toughest conferences in the state.

"Many of the teams are returning a lot of their key players from last year and we will have to perform at a high level on a consistent basis to be successful," said Phelps. "I think every team can probably be the favorite if they play up to their abilities. I wouldn't count any of the teams out because they are all capable of winning on any given night. You need to bring your 'A' game every night or bad things will happen."




