City of Ida Grove Council Meeting Minutes Tuesday, Sept. 2, 2025 5:30 p.m.

City Hall, 403 3rd Street 1. Call to Order: Mayor Nathan Weitl called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. 2. Roll Call: Council Present: Gregor Ernst, Jeff Miesner, Jason Schable and Revnold McLead. Councilman Jared Bogue was absent. Others in attendance were Fire Chief Scott Van Dusen. McClure Engineering Cody Forch & Michael Washburn, Attorney Justin Reininger and Deputy Clerk Kelly Young. Present electronically were Auditor Abby Schrek and T-Mobile's Chris Stryker. 3. Approval of Agenda: Motion by Ernst, second by Miesner to approve. Motion carried 4-0. 4. Abby Schrek, T. P. Anderson & Company - FY2025 Audit Draft: Schrek presented the City's FY25 annual audit results and shared with council the newer GASB Standards moving forward. Motion by Ernst, second by Miesner to approve the annual draft audit. Motion carried 4-0. 5. Scott Van Dusen, Fire Chief: a. Fire Station Roof Replacement: Van Dusen shared with council that the fire station roof is leaking, mostly due to the numerous additions to the building over the years. He presented council with repair quotes and also spoke about a replacement quote he had gotten, that he did not have with him, but was not much more than the repair costs. Council would like to see the replacement quote and advised Van Dusen to obtain additional quotes for roof replacement for the next meeting. b. Length of Service Award Program: Van Dusen shared this is a new investment program the state is offering for volunteer firefighters. The program would be individually point based regarding attendance to meetings, fundraisers, fire calls and training and the fireman could earn up to \$500 annually. The City would be required to pay \$167 of the cost and the state would cover the remainder. Van Dusen felt this would be a great incentive when getting new firemen on the department and also may help retain the ones already on. Council were interested in this program and asked for further information to be added to the next agenda. 6. McClure Engineering, Cody & Michael - Proposed Scope and Plan of Action to Review Water & Wastewater Systems: Forch and Washburn presented an agreement for Mc-Clure to review our current design for a wastewater treatment plant upgrade that when bids came back, were over budget. McClure assures they can reduce costs of the design and/or give a different concept to fit the City's budget. They also would like to research our new water well to give feedback on that. Washburn

informed council the report would take 5-6 months. Motion by Ernst, second by Miesner to approve the proposed scope and plan of action to review water and wastewater systems. Motion carried 4-0. 7. Chris Stryker, T Mobile Proposed Antenna Agreement: Ernst abstained due to conflict of interest. Stryker presented T-Mobile's proposed antenna agreement asking council for approval of location and design. Council requested some language changes and once complete, will add to the next agenda for review. 8. Consent Agenda: Motion by Ernst, second by Miesner to approve the consent agenda consisting of the following: Clerk's Report, claims in the amount of \$594,285.41, financials, minutes of the 5/18/2025 meeting, class C w/ outdoor service alcohol license for Lucky Wife Wine Slushies effective Sept. 4. 2025 (5 day event at Godbersen Park), permits and correspondence. Motion carried 4-0. 9. Reinvest Library Certificate of Deposit: Bids were received from Shelby County State Bank as follows: 12 month at 3.70% and 18 months at 3.70%. Bids were received from United Bank of Iowa as follows: 12 months at 3.70%, 18 months at 4.00% and 24 months at 3.90%. The Library Board recommends approval of UBI's 18 month term at 4.00%. Motion by Ernst, second by McLead to approve the

Library Board's recommendation. Motion carried 4-0. 10. Resolution 2025-41 Transfer Funds from Sewer to Sewer Capital Improvement Project & Sewer Sinking Fund: Motion by Ernst, second by Schable to approve Resolution 2025-41. Motion carried 4-0. 11. Resolution 2025-42 Hire Ally Lundell, Rec Center Receptionist \$9.50/hour: Motion by Ernst, second by McLead to approve Resolution 2025-42. Motion carried 4-0. 12. Resolution 2025-43 Setting Time and Place of Hearing on Proposal to Sell Property at 408 Second Street: Motion by McLead, second by Schable to approve Resolution 2025-43. Motion carried 4-0. 13. Ordering Publication of Hearing Notice on Proposal to Sell the Property at 408 Second Street: Motion by McLead, second by Schable to order publication for hearing on proposal to sell the property at 408 Second Street. Motion carried 4-0. 14. Request to Purchase City Property Located on Jacob Avenue: McLead abstained due to conflict of interest. Motion by Ernst, second by Schable to entertain the request to purchase city property located at Jacob's Ave. Motion carried 3-0. Ernst left the meeting at this time. 15. Draft Agreement for Sale of City Property Located on Elm & Maple Street: Council reviewed a draft agreement for stipulations for

selling the empty lots. Motion by Miesner, second by McLead to approve the draft agreement, with no changes. Motion carried 3-0. 16. Levee Slip Line Project - Nelson & Rock Request for Additional Payment: Construction portion of the project is complete. Contractor is requesting additional payments totaling \$5,280. Motion by Miesner, second by McLead to approve payment #1 in the amount of \$3,780 and payment #3 in the amount of \$500, excluding payment #2 in the amount of \$1,000. Motion carried 3-0. 17. 402-406 Second Street Post Demolition Direction: Costs for bracing the remaining wall or for work to be completed at 402 Second Street were not available at the time of the meeting; no action taken. 18. Compost & Brush Piles - Security System: Due to the continued illegal dumping at the compost and brush piles, council reviewed quotes for needed security cameras. They also discussed other entities of the city that may need cameras so they wanted to choose a system that could be expanded upon. Motion by McLead. second by Schable to approve Feld Fire's quote, adding a third camera not to exceed \$9,500 Motion carried 3-0. 19. Move into Closed Session as per: Section 21.5 (1) Closed Session 1. A governmental body may hold a closed session only by affirmative public vote of
