The Battle Creek City Council met in regular session on Tuesday, Jan. 13, 2026, at 6 p.m. at the Community Hall. Mayor Jary Vermeys presided over the meeting. Council members present: Jill Wingert, Judy Schau, Jessica Wallace and Daltyn Swanger. Abby Fundermann was absent.

Mayor Vermeys called the meeting to order. Motion by Wingert, seconded by Schau to approve the meeting minutes and agenda. Motion carried.

Nancy Schoen was present for the ambulance. They have received a couple of applicants, EMT classes begin next week in Ida Grove, and she continues to work on the financials for October, November and December.

Corey Tarr, PWS, presented an estimate for CIT to complete the project of locating and cleaning out the sewer line to the lift station, radios were purchased with a grant to improve communication among the maintenance personnel due to poor cell reception, one well has been offline for repairs but is expected to be up and running by next week, Corey will sign up with DNR to begin the process of testing to become a certified operator which will be paid for by the city. As for the FY26 budget, Corey suggested the council consider updating the pickup, paying the part-time maintenance employees the same rate, and purchasing a new heavy-duty blade for the dump truck for snow removal.

Justin Reitz, Fire Chief, presented the FY26 budget with a \$2,000 increase due to increasing costs in repairs and insurance. Township contributions were discussed. Motion by Wallace, seconded by Swanger to approve Resolution 2026-02 Adoption of the Iowa LOSAP Program. Motion carried.

Motion by Wingert, seconded by Wallace to approve the request from Rebecca Dance at 602 Walnut Street to allow her until Jan. 31 to remove the van and Impala from the property. Motion carried.

Library minutes and FY26 budget were reviewed.

Mayor Vermeys welcomed Wallace and Swanger to the council,

touched on the FY27 budget process and increased expenses in the water and sewer funds, and discussed a city liquidation sale as a source of revenue.

Motion in form of Resolution 2026-03 Approving the Cherokee-Ida Solid Waste Commission Planning Area 2026 Solid Waste Comprehensive Plan Update by Wingert, seconded by Schau. Motion carried.

Motion by Wingert, seconded by Swanger to approve the Fire Department's FY27 Budget increase of \$2,000 overall from the current year increasing the city support to \$14,125 from \$13,625 over the current year. Motion carried.

Motion by Wingert, seconded by Wallace to approve the Ambulance Department's FY27 Budget with no increase in the city's portion of \$11,000. Motion carried.

Motion by Wallace, seconded by Schau to table the library budget allowing Mayor Vermeys time to complete his departmental audit and a full disclosure of funds is complete. Motion carried.

Motion by Wingert, seconded by Schau to approve an increase of \$2/hr. to Nathaniel Tarr's hourly rate to \$20/hr. effective immediately. Motion carried.

Motion by Wingert, seconded by Wallace to increase both Nathaniel Tarr and Lee Wallace \$0.50/hr. to \$20.50/hr. effective July 1. Jessica Wallace abstain. Motion carried.

The Odebolt Arthur Battle Creek Ida Grove (OABCIG) School Board met for the Public Hearing and Regular Meeting on Monday, Jan. 12, 2026, at 6:30 p.m. in the boardroom at the OABCIG High School in Ida Grove.

**Call to Order** - Vice President Alesch called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. The board recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Julia Mogensen, Board Secretary, conducted a roll call as follows:

**Present:** Konradi, Marth, Alesch, Goodman, Jacobson, and Lundell. Absent: Loger.

**Approval of Agenda** - It was moved by Goodman, seconded by Marth, to approve the agenda of the Public Hearing and Regular Meeting as published. Ayes: 6. Nays: 0. Motion carried.

**Welcome Visitors** - None.

**Public Comments to the Board:** None.

**Public Hearing to Propose OABCIG Continue Participation in the Instructional Support Levy for FY27-FY31** - President Alesch opened the public hearing at 6:32 p.m. and invited questions and comments. PUBLIC HEARING TO

PROPOSE OABCIG CONTINUE PARTICIPATION IN THE INSTRUCTIONAL SUPPORT LEVY FOR FY27-FY31.

Shall the Board of Directors of the OABCIG Community School District in the Counties of Ida, Woodbury, Sac, and Crawford, State of Iowa, be authorized for a period of five years, to levy and impose an instructional support tax in an amount (after taking into consideration instructional support state aid) of not exceeding ten percent (10%) of the total regular program district cost for the budget year and monies received under Section 257.14, Code of Iowa, as a budget adjustment for the budget year, and be authorized annually, in combination, as determined by the Board, to levy a combination of an instructional support property tax upon all the taxable property within the school district, commencing with the levy of property taxes for collection in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2027, and to impose an instructional support income surtax upon the state individual income tax of each individual income taxpayer resident in the school district on Dec. 31 for each calendar year commencing with calendar year 2026, or each year thereafter, (the percent of income surtax not to exceed twenty percent (20%) to be determined by the board for each fiscal year) to be used for any general fund purpose

except for supplanting funds authorized to be received under Sections 257.41, 257.46, 298.2 and 298.4 of the Code of Iowa or to cover any deficiencies in funding for special education instructional services resulting from the application of the special education weighting plan under Section 256B.9?

**Public Comments:** None.

There being no questions or comments, President Alesch closed the public hearing at 6:34 p.m.

**Approval of Consent Agenda** - It was moved by Goodman to approve the Consent Agenda. Consent agenda consisted of minutes, claims totaling \$379,493.07, a resignation from cook Jean Barry, and contract approval for Mariah Nutt, HS FCS for 2026-27, pending certification. Second by Jacobson to approve the Consent Agenda. Motion carried 6/0.

**Curriculum Report** - The board was given a presentation to view regarding the elementary and middle school art activities by art teachers Kyra Martin and Madison Allen. The music department staff, Niel Anders, Dave Kovarna, Natalie Bradburn, Renee Fritz, and Emmett White, all attended and shared information with the board about their programs and activities.

**Director Reports** - The board reviewed director reports.

**Superintendent Report** - Mr. Alexander shared with the board that

budget preparations and meetings are underway, the State has additional oversight requirements that will be implemented for the upcoming ISASP testing, and he met with Gregor Ernst to establish a participation requirement in order to establish a school sponsored soccer program, final decision to be made before the end of the current school year for the 2026-27 soccer season. Mr. Alexander also told the board about the completion of outstanding building projects in the Odebolt building and upcoming potential projects district wide. The Ida Grove Elementary fire alarm replacement is waiting on the approval of the Fire Marshall before work can begin. Senator Jason Schultz visited the OABCIG district and Mr. Alexander gave him a tour of the High School facilities as well as shared financial information for his consideration in upcoming legislative sessions.

**Approve Offering One Additional Certified Staff Early Retirement Incentive for 2025-26** - Goodman moved to approve the recommended retirement incentive plan to eligible individuals for one additional certified staff of the OABCIG School District. Second by Marth. Ayes: 6. Nays: 0. Motion Carried.

**Approve applications for the OABCIG Early Retirement Incentive** - Jacobson moved to approve the applications for the early retirement incentive plan from Larry Al-

len, Kandace Ehrig, Rita Freese, Donna Rasmussen, Mike Iversen, and Shelly Schiernbeck. Second by Marth. Ayes: 6. Nays: 0. Motion Carried.

**Approve OABCIG's Continued participation in the instructional support levy for FY27-FY31** - Lundell moved to approve the Resolution of Continued Participation in the Instructional Support Levy for the OABCIG School District for FY27-FY31. Second by Goodman. Roll Call Vote: Ayes: Alesch, Lundell, Marth, Goodman, Jacobson, and Konradi. Nays: 0. Motion Carried.
